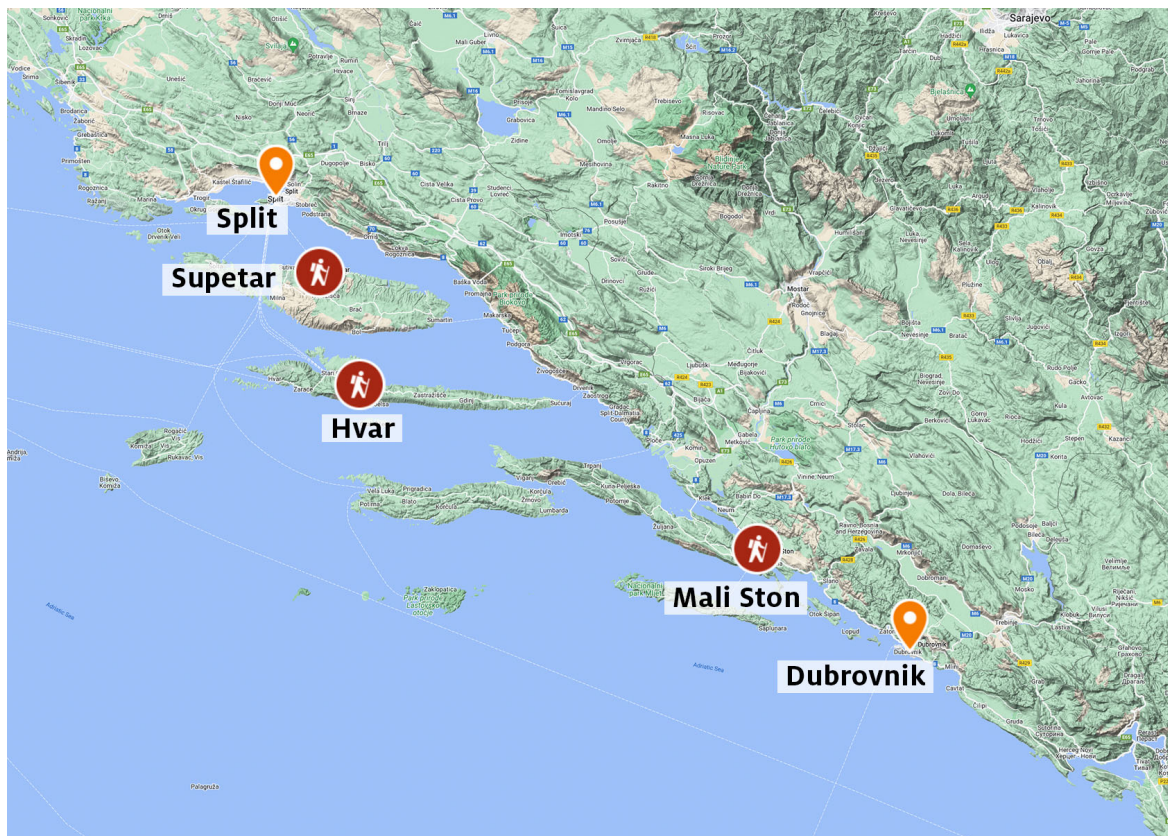


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About Your Walk

Dubrovnik, the beautiful walled city on the Adriatic, is the starting point for island hopping in unspoiled Croatia. As we travel north, footpaths will take us through cypress woods, along coastal headlands and rural tracks, into dramatic gorges and along rambling streets. The sparkling sea views and sleepy harbor villages with their milk-white limestone buildings are the perfect environment for the steady pace of life and relaxed café culture. We'll stop along the way to see world famous sites like the Great Wall in Ston and the breathtaking Diocletian's Palace in Split. Unpretentious and still uncommercialized, there is so much to celebrate in Croatia's old world ways. This is a Walk that transports us to another place and time, and takes us on an unforgettable journey that is good for the soul.

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Walk Itinerary

Sunday

Meet at our hotel for a guided walk through Dubrovnik, followed by some free time before our Welcome Reception and Dinner at a local restaurant.

Monday

A morning boat trip takes us to explore the lovely island of Lopud. We head back to the mainland via Ston, to walk along its dramatic medieval walls. We'll pass ancient salt pans still in operation, before continuing to our hotel in Mali Ston, a sleepy village of old stone houses.

Tuesday

This morning, a scenic drive leads to the ferry at Drvenik, and onward to the resort island of Hvar. We walk from the ancient hilltop village of Velo Grablje, with its stone houses, famous for its lavender and olive oil. A dry brook serves as our path to Malo Grablje, a local curiosity, then lunch in a remote family run tavern. Tonight, we'll stay at a spa hotel overlooking Hvar harbor.

Wednesday

After a short drive across the isle of Hvar to our drop off point on Humac Hill, we enjoy stunning views of the neighboring islands and the Stari Grad Plain World Heritage Site. We gradually make our way down to the picturesque gorge village of Pitve for lunch at a family run tavern known for its organic homemade specialties. From here we continue to Hvar town for some free time and a late-afternoon Croatian cooking class followed by dinner.

Thursday

A private speedboat takes us to Brač, where we begin our slow ascent alongside terraced stone walls to Skrip, the oldest settlement on the island. After a visit, head through open fields to a family home for an unforgettable 'farm to table' lunch. This afternoon, walk past vineyards and olive groves to Supetar.

Drive to the famous Vidova Gora mountaintop, then walk down the gorge to the remote Blaca Monastery. A local guide explains its fascinating history. We'll continue to an isolated bay by day's end, where a private boat awaits to take us to a secluded terrace restaurant overlooking the sea.

The morning ferry takes us to Split, a vibrant city with the palace of Roman Emperor Diocletian at its heart. We explore the palace and Old Town before our Farewell Dinner.

Hotel Ostrea

Located in the picturesque fishing port of Mali Ston ('Little Ston'), this attractive hotel is built of the traditional stone of the area and has an enviable location overlooking the crystal clear blue water of the harbour. Completely renovated in 1998 and run by one of the oldest families in the town, the hotel has won the Antun Stifanic state award for tourism and catering. Each bedroom has an ensuite bathroom, individual furnishings and is beautifully decorated with all the usual amenities of a high quality hotel including hair dryer and WiFi internet access. Weather permitting, breakfast is taken on the open air terrace or can be taken inside in the traditional Maslina salon in cooler weather. Dinner is served in the widely-renowned Kaptanova Luca ('Captain's House') which has an attractive location on the waterfront and specialises in superb dishes made from local catches from the bay - mussels, oysters, octopus and fish.

Located in Sutivan, the rooms in Hotel Lemongarden combine the elegance of a southern French country house with the splendor of a Venetian palace and the charm of an Adriatic fishing village. Thick, rough sandstone walls meet handmade furniture, hand-blown chandeliers, and floors made of Brač marble: modern design meets wild, Mediterranean blossoms.
