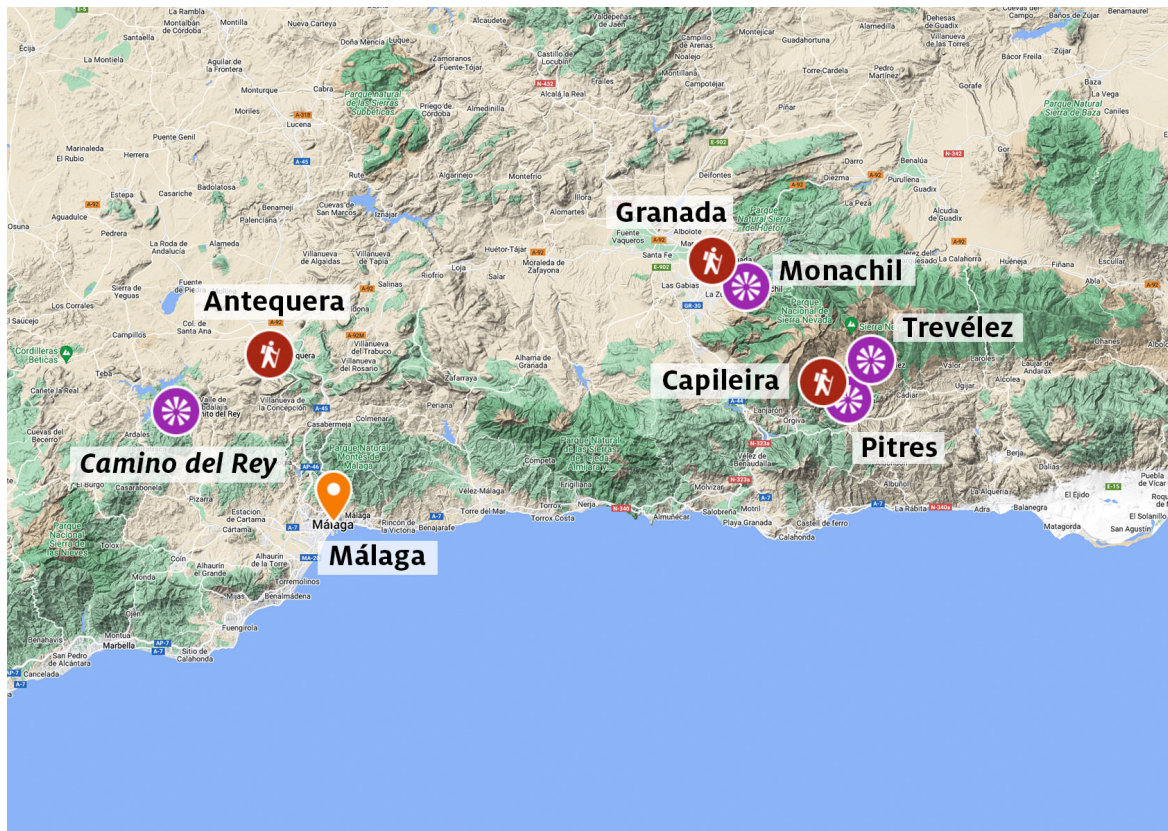
About Your Walk

Plunge into the beating heart of Andalucía, famed for its vibrant flamenco culture, historic Moorish architecture, picturesque white-washed villages, delectable tapas, and warm, sunny climate. This is the Spain of the mind's eye, where grape vines, mango, orange, lemon and avocado trees thrive alongside ancient olive and almond groves. Take the opportunity to explore Málaga, the birthplace of Pablo Picasso, before we meet and begin our adventure.

Experience the thrill of Caminito del Rey, a dramatic walkway perched high above a gorge before exploring the historic heart of Antequera, known as the "Heart of Andalucía," Walk through the famous, unspoiled "white villages" and marvel at the Sierra Nevada's breathtaking peaks. Discover the traditional, colorful craft of Jarapas carpet-making. Taste the famous ham of Andalucía's highest village, Trevelez, cured in the pure mountain air and boasting a rich, savory flavor and tender texture. Take time to relax and rejuvenate with a visit to a hammam, a traditional Moorish bathhouse, or, by complete contrast, set your feet tapping at a passionate flamenco show!

Then drink in the splendor of Granada and the stunning Alhambra, and stroll through the atmospheric Albaicín quarter, ending our journey with a sunset view from San Nicolás and a final dinner overlooking the ancient palace.

Walk Location



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Walk Itinerary

Sunday

Arrive at Málaga airport, on the Costa del Sol. Depending on your arrival time, you may find the time to explore Málaga, the birthplace of Pablo Picasso. Meet your guides at the Grand Hotel Miramar, before the transfer to Antequera. Welcome dinner at our hotel in the evening.

Monday

A short transfer takes us to the Caminito del Rey (The King's Path). This walk includes the spectacular footbridge hanging over the narrow pass of Los Gaitanes Gorge, which was originally built between 1901 and 1905 by fishermen from Málaga to connect two hydroelectric facilities. What is now called the Air Path is built 350 feet above the gorge, some sections have a glass floor to admire the gorge and the old path. In the afternoon, there is time to explore the old town center of Antequera.

Tuesday

After breakfast, transfer to the south side of the Sierra Nevada. Here in the Alpujarras, a largely unspoiled mountain region, you will set off on the route of the "Pueblos Blancos" (white villages) through the river valley, sometimes deeply incised, with ample views of the highest peaks in Spain. The legacy of the Moors is still visible in Andalucía today. This also includes ingenious irrigation systems in the mountains. We hike to the upper water channel. The panorama of the Sierra Nevada mountain range unfolds before you, framed by untouched nature with rushing mountain streams. Descend with a fantastic panoramic view of the Poqueira gorge and its ancient villages. After lunch at a local restaurant in Pampaneira we learn how the typical carpets "Jarapas" carpets are made. Transfer to our hotel in Capileira or opt to reach town on old shepherds' paths and forest tracks.

Wednesday

After breakfast and a short transfer past holm oaks, we circle a mighty mountain ridge before leaving the high trail and beginning the descent to Pitres, perhaps the most original and beautiful villages of the Alpujarra. Walk along old paths to Busquistar. After the walk and another short transfer, we visit the highest Andalusian village: Trevelez - famous for its ham - where we have a tour of one of the amazing "secadero de jamón" where the ham is dried. We have a tasting of the local products and lunch. The remainder of the afternoon is spent in Capileira.

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Thursday

A short transfer out of Granada brings us to an unexpected trail that features waterfalls, swimming holes, narrow tracks, hanging bridges, and wide-open vistas, all in a few hours. You will enjoy spectacular views of the valley from the trails upper reaches. In spring, the green meadows are a riot of colorful wildflowers. We have lunch in Monachile village before proceeding to Granada. Opt for a hamman in the old quarter of town. Or what about a flamenco show in a cave?

Friday

Start the day with a guided tour of the Alhambra, a UNESCO World Heritage site. After lunch, we walk in the winding alleyways with Arabic-style bazaars and the old Moorish quarter of Albaicín. You can see one of the most beautiful sunsets from the San Nicolás viewpoint. During our last dinner together in the Albaicín, you will have a spectacular view of the Alhambra by night.

After breakfast, we transfer to Málaga airport or to Granada train station.

Parador de Antequera

If there's a Parador that breaks with the historical building trend to become a symbol of modernity, it's the Parador de Antequera. Located in a garden area of the city, it's the ideal place to relax and rest. Its huge windows let light flood in from all corners and give you views of a magnificent Andalusian landscape, with warm sunsets over the Antequera plain and rock formations such as the Peña de los Enamorados or Lovers' Peak. To relax, we recommend a sun lounger by the pool, a drink on the terrace, and the scent of flowers from the pleasant gardens. The hotel rooms are spacious with pale coloring on the ceilings and walls. They combine design and modern services. The restaurant serves traditional regional cuisine made with fresh, seasonal produce, alongside fine Spanish wines. There is also a cafe-bar

Hotel Finca los Llanos

Finca Los Llanos is a rural hotel located in the town of Capileira, at an altitude of 1,436 meters, one of the highest towns on the Iberian Peninsula. The Poqueira River runs by it, carrying the melted snow of the Sierra Nevada to the sea. Hotel Finca Los Llanos was created in 1990, since then it has a great reputation for its customer service. It consists of 44 rooms, spread over three buildings, each with a different decoration and style. All guestrooms are fully equipped with heating, TV, fridge, hairdryer and a telephone, many with a balcony or terrace with wonderful views. The Gloria restaurant serves traditional cuisine but with a modern touch. The terrace-bar Sotillo Vieja is the best area of the hotel to enjoy the views, the fresh air and at the same time savor exquisite cocktails. Also the outdoor pool offers incredible views of the Poqueira cliffs. The hotel has its own vegetable garden and orchard.

Alhambra Palace Hotel
